The Rainforest Alliance offers services, including standards and certification, that can help companies in parts of their due diligence.

However, the responsibility to conduct due diligence remains with companies themselves.

The applicability of using certification in due diligence may differ, depending on:

- The standard
- The sector
- •The company's position in the supply chain
- •The most salient risk issues
- •The company's degree of leverage
- Other factors


HRDD system within certification - Assess-and-address

- Clear guidance and tools to support implementation and continuous improvement




Fundamental difference in approach


